Sound out words...

"Look at the word"

keep your eyes on the text "Slide through the word"

blend the sounds from beginning to end

"Finger stretch the word"

raise a finger for each sound left to right **"Try a different sound"** prompt with the sound

"Chunk the word"

break the word into syllables and familiar parts



Finally, re-read the sentence and ask, does that make sense?

Read and Discuss...



Before

What made you choose this book? What do you think this book will be about?

During

What has happened so far? What do you think will happen next? Have you learned any new words or facts so far? Does this book remind you of anything in your life?

After

Can you tell me what you read in your own words? What was your favorite part? Did the book end the way you thought it would? How would you change the ending if you could?

The Science of Reading

An evidence-based approach to teaching reading that emphasizes the <u>systematic</u> and <u>explicit</u> instruction of **phonics**, **decoding skills**, and **comprehension strategies**.



Help your child break sentences into **words**, words into **syllables**, and syllables into **sounds**

Examples:

Pin - /p/ /i/ /n/ Fish - /f/ /i/ /sh/ Blue - /b/ /l/ /oo/ Jump - /j/ /u/ /m/ /p/ Stamp - /s/ /t/ /a/ /m/ /p/
